A three year programme on **Improving small farmer livelihoods in rainfed areas through climate resilient farming practices** was implemented by AME Foundation in 2017, The programme was implemented in 60 villages across Dharwad and Chintamani districts in Karnataka and Dharmapuri in Tamil Nadu. The final year of the project focused on measuring the outcomes of the project, besides implementing various field activities.


